I was born in Mexico City and I have lived in Oaxaca since 2003. Upon arriving in this beautiful city, I found out about the world of community work, first as a professional architect and later participating with various non-profit organizations.

My entry into the non-profit world has taught me a lot about the needs of communities. In addition, I have become familiar with the strengths of each social group, motivating them to develop those strengths to make significant and permanent changes. I believe that education, capacity building, and defining clear goals are key to helping vulnerable groups strengthen and shape their future and advance their dreams.

I have collaborated with *Fundación Comunitaria Oaxaca*; *Centro Oaxaqueño de Rehabilitación de Audición y Lenguaje (CORAL)*. Currently, I am the Managing Director of *Fundación En Vía* and serve on the Board of the *Friends of the Oaxaca Learning Center*. As an architect, I am carrying out the design and the enlargement of *Centro de Aprendizaje de Oaxaca*.

On a personal level, I am interested in sustainability and developed a brief course that I teach each year to University of Washington students. The principles of sustainability are an important axis of my work and teach me how social, economic, and environmental elements can form an integrated system.
